As reported in recent Live Green in Plano publication, Mathews Elementary was recognized under the City
of Plano's Green School Program that teaches and models environmental stewardship. The primary goal
of the partnership between PISD and the City of Plano is to emphasize proper recycling. The program
rewards schools that empower students, staff and their community to adopt additional sustainable
practices. Mathews was one of only 5 schools across all of PISD that won cash award for their efforts that



went above and beyond program requirements, including special recycling and reuse collections, social media and video campaigns, school gardens and more. The cash awards will be used to enrich their respective environmental education and outreach initiatives next school year. We are proud of this accomplishment by Mathews leadership, teachers and staff, along with great support from students and parents.

- Speaking of schools, <u>Plano school year starts this Wednesday</u>, <u>August 9</u>. Let's be extra careful on the roads with increased traffic and children and parent pedestrian traffic.
- As reported previously, after years of work by WHOA leadership with the
 City of Plano, the screening wall along Independence is scheduled to be
 replaced starting by early 2024. We will see new wall from Clymer to
 Caravan entrances. Since it is expected that the landscaping at both
 entrances will be replaced by the City of Plano at the end of the project,
 we will not be adding or changing any plantings at these entrances for
 the balance of this year.







- Get ready for the North Texas Food Bank (NTFB) Peanut Butter Drive that runs September 1-30. During these challenging economic times for so many families in North Texas facing sizable increases in food costs over the past few years, the annual Peanut Butter Drive campaign brings together North Texas cities, organizations, schools, and faith-based groups to collect peanut butter and other nut butters. The peanut butter collected is then distributed throughout the NTFB feeding network. In the past years, Whiffletree neighbors have been extremely generous in their support of this program and we hope this continues in 2023. You will be able to make financial donations online via our website which will contain a link to the NTFB website (NTFB created a special donation collection page for Whiffletree). You can also purchase Peanut Butter and drop them off at the home of a Whiffletree neighbor. Look for more information as we get closer to September 1 and the program start.
- Additional events planned for later this year include:
 - o National Night Out held at Prairie Meadow Park (next to Mathews) Evening of October 3
 - Plano Fittest Neighborhood in Plano Competition November 1-30
 - Yard of the Month competition for best holiday decorations December
- During these times with near historic heat and drought, there are 3 free apps that you can download that can help you, your neighbors and our region manage our vital water and energy resources through these challenging times. They are:
 - <u>WaterMyYard</u> app, provided by Texas A&M, uses local weather data to provide free weekly watering advice. WaterMyYard can help your water bill, while at the same time help to conserve Texas water resources for the future.
 - My Oncor app provides numerous services, including ability to report and track progress on power outages, manage new service requests and receive real time news updates from Oncor, including efficiency and safety tips.
 - <u>ERCOT</u> app. ERCOT, The Electric Reliability Council of Texas operates Texas's electrical grid. This
 app reports real time electricity demand and supply as well as information about available
 electricity capacity, the mix of electricity sources and any news about actions we as consumer of
 electricity should in the event of projected tight supply.

All these apps are available for Apple and Android devices. You can take a look at them and decide if they could be good information for you and your family.

• We need your support! Currently, 296 of the 477 homes in Whiffletree have paid the voluntary dues. Membership dues are our only source of income and fund the maintenance of our beautiful entrances and fund social events that give Whiffletree neighbors the opportunity to meet their fellow neighbors. Whiffletree annual dues payment is \$145 by check and \$150 for online payment, which is lower than all surrounding neighborhoods. You may send check in the amount of \$145 (payable to WHOA) to Whiffletree HOA, PMB 288, 3948 Legacy Dr, Ste 106, Plano, TX 75023. You also can pay online at https://www.mywhiffletreehoa.com/pay-dues. We incur a service charge for online payments, hence online dues cost is \$150.
