- National Night Out was held at Prairie Meadow Park on Tuesday, October 3.   dues primarily are used to maintain our beautiful entrances and hold fun social events.
- After the brutal summer heat took its toll on our lawns and gardens, we decided to delay selection of Yard of the Month (YOM) in September and move it to October with its cooler and wetter weather. The YOM team is searching the neighborhood and expects to make a selection for October later this week. Once selected, we will place the YOM banner, take photos and announce winner via email and post on website. YOM winner receives \$100 gift card at Shades of Green Nursery in Frisco. To be eligible for YOM award, you do need to be a paid WHOA member, another reason to pay your dues!
- We hope you are enjoying the fall lighting at the Marchman entrance. You may have noticed that the lights are on 24/7. There are 2 reasons for the lights being on all the time. They are:
  - $_{\odot}$   $\,$  The lights are all LED and consume very little electricity and
  - We have experienced problems in the past where the outdoor rated timer switches trip off in wet weather like we are having this week. Hence the decision to leave these lights on all the time instead of having to physically go to the corner and reset the timer switches when they trip off.
- Plano Winter outdoor watering guidelines are effective November 1- March 31, where residents are asked to water only once per week. Residential addresses with an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7 and 9) as their last digit water Tuesdays. Residential addresses with an even number (0, 2, 4, 6 and 8) as their last digit water Thursdays. Residents are encouraged to water when needed and only on your assigned watering day. You may not need to water if rain is in the forecast. Subscribe to <u>WaterMyYard.org</u> for weekly watering recommendations.
