Committees Reports

<u>Treasurer's Report – Bill Ostergren</u>

- FY25 Budget proposal
 - Bill presented the report for the 2023-2024 Fiscal Year.
 - Receipts were less than budgeted
 - Expenses were less than budgeted, though a little more than receipts.
 - Bill presented the proposed budget for the 2024-2025 (FY25) Fiscal Year.
 - Emphasis on beautification for the entrances
 - Cutbacks on some items to align with previous FY budget.
 - It was noted that the assumption is based on similar membership income and the timing of expenses.
 - A motion was made and seconded to approve the FY25 Budget as proposed

Beautification Report – Tom Dixon

- Beautification involves planting, irrigation, and lighting of 4 entrances to the neighborhood.
- 5 Yard of the Month (YOM) awards were given in the past FY. Thanks to Robert Simmons for leading the YOM program.
- 3 Holiday lights awards given.
- No significant construction at the entrances this year.
- WHOA was awarded a neighborhood vitality and beautification grant that was applied for last year, and we will be using it for a project in April this month to replace dead or unhealthy bushes. This project will cost \$663 and the City of Plano will pay \$464 of that with the grant.
- Screening wall project on Independence:
 - o The City of Plano will replace the screening wall between Clymer and Caravan.
 - O Date still to be determined but expected to be this year.
 - o Entrance plantings will need to be replaced after the screening wall project is complete.
 - o City of Plano will reimburse 100% for any damage caused by the screening wall project.
- Recently, annuals planted, and entrances are in good shape.
- 5 YOMs and 3 holiday lighting awards planned for FY25. Shades of Green will continue to sponsor.
- A plea was made for more volunteers for the Beautification and YOM Committees

<u>Crime Watch – Tom Moore</u>

- March 20, 2024 Tom presented at a Crime Prevention Unit event at the Davis Library. The
 presentation was for neighborhoods that are interested in becoming more involved in Crime
 Watch. Tom represented Whiffletree's Crime Watch activity as a Platinum neighborhood.
- Tom will coordinate the Plano Fire Department and Plano Police Department for the annual 4th of July Parade.
- National Night Out is the first Tuesday in October, October 1, 2024.

Membership - HB Bartz

- Membership drive active for 7 weeks.
 - o Emails sent to all available email addresses 110 paid dues after the email reminder.
 - o Paper invoices sent to those without email or had not paid yet.
 - o Currently, 190 paid member households this is low compared to last year (>300)
 - o HB will send 190 thank you letters with 2024 member stickers for the WHOA signs.
 - In addition, he will request feedback if neighbors need a new sign
 - And a reminder to update their information for the directory
 - o HB has a neighbor to volunteer to help him with these activities.
 - Directories
 - An online directory is in the logistics planning stage.
 - Feedback from neighbors will be requested following the first online directory made available.
 - Option for a paper directory will be available.
 - HB will research ways to reduce the costs of the directory, ex. Coupons, paid advertisements, etc.
